Call for Submissions: Seeking Stratford's 2026 Youth Poet Laureate

In partnership with Destination Stratford and Stratford Public Library

**Stratford, November 3, 2025** — Destination Stratford and Stratford Public Library are once again partnering to select the next Youth Poet Laureate for the 2026 term.

The Stratford Poet Laureate Program celebrates the voices of literary and spoken word artists who enrich our community through poetry. Earlier this year, Quinn Mayer was appointed as Stratford's inaugural Youth Poet Laureate and is currently completing their one-year term. Reflecting on the experience, Quinn shared:

"I am so honoured to have been Stratford's first-ever Youth Poet Laureate. I am so thankful to have been involved in such a wonderful program, and to help shape it for my successors going forward."

David Stones, Stratford's inaugural Poet Laureate, continues to serve in his three-year term.

#### About the Youth Poet Laureate Position

The Youth Poet Laureate recognizes a young poet (ages 14–24) whose work reflects themes meaningful to Stratford-area youth. Serving as an ambassador for poetry, language, and the arts, this one-year position amplifies youth voices and encourages creative engagement with words and ideas.

Throughout the term, the Youth Poet Laureate will be invited to present their work at local events and help foster a deeper appreciation for poetry and the arts in Stratford and the surrounding region.

## **Eligibility Requirements**

Applicants for the Youth Poet Laureate position must:

- Be nominated or submit a self-nomination.
- Meet the age requirements outlined for the position.
- Have a meaningful connection to Stratford and area.
- Be a poet, spoken word artist, or storyteller with an established or emerging body of work.
- Demonstrate a strong interest in poetry, storytelling, and the literary or performing arts.
- Be able to serve as an ambassador for literacy, poetry and the arts.
- Be willing to fulfill the responsibilities of the role.
