#### TERRITORIAL ACKNOWLEDGMENT

## INTERIM CEO, KRISTA ROBINSON

In 2022 we saw pre-pandemic services almost fully restored! Circulation of materials was 25% higher than in 2019. Programming has reached new levels as well, at 40% higher than pre-pandemic.

Our library received some much needed upgrades this year. Carpet was replaced on both children and adult floors, the children's service desk was replaced and our children's floor restrooms were completely renovated. These upgrades have made our space much more attractive and accessible. Our front garden was also landscaped by the Stratford Horticultural Society. We look forward to seeing the new garden grow in 2023!

In December, our CEO, Julia Merritt left SPL for a new role in Nova Scotia. I want to thank Julia for over nine years of leadership at SPL and we wish her all the best!

With a new Library Board and strategic directions for 2023, I'm excited to see where the new year takes us!

#### SUMMER PROGRAM **SUCCESS**

Summer 2022 saw a record breaking number of registrants in the TD Summer Reading club -862 youth registered!

Additionally 7,824 people participated in 278 programs over the course of the summer. Exploring Stratford was an especially popular program with visits to the airport, bus terminal, fire department, and public works department.

#### MAKERSPACE **CELEBRATED 5 YEARS**

In October the MakerSpace celebrated 5 years of making. Thanks to a partnership with Perth Community **Futures Development** Corporation, the MakerSpace was open 5 days a week in 2022.

#### **FINE FREE**

2022 was the first full year officially Fine Free. 99% of the collection now circulates without late penalties. A material recovery service was contracted.

#### ACCESSIBILITY **UPGRADES**

In November a new children's service desk was replaced and in Noveminstalled. The desk was by not only the public, but floor carpet. Both were also for staff.
