You will commit to

- 1 hour Zoom call per week for 7 consecutive Thursdays to do writing exercises and share feedback on your works in progress (July 7 to Aug 18)
- participate in the event to launch this year's 2nd Annual Writer's In-Residence anthology, 'Forest of Words,' where you get to be the 'local author' (Aug 30)
- participate with your peers in a collaborative and supportive way
- be open to feedback
- write in the way that means the most to you

What you will do (and what you will get out of it)

- write poems, stories or essays with help and feedback along the way
- in weekly sessions, collaborate and discuss work with other participants
- learn about editing cycles and benefit from feedback circles
- interact with a local author on a select week: benefit from their advice and feedback on your work
- receive a copy of the Anthology (put together using the library MakerSpace) at the end of the session
- attend the Book Launch Party and have the opportunity to read a selection from your work and interact with attendees
- be proud and boost your confidence
